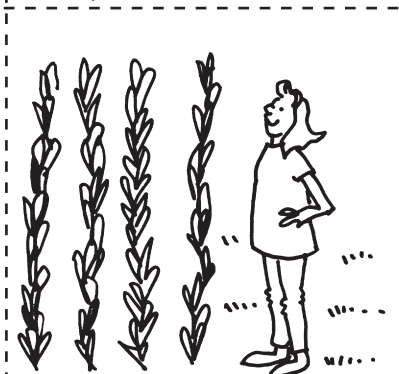
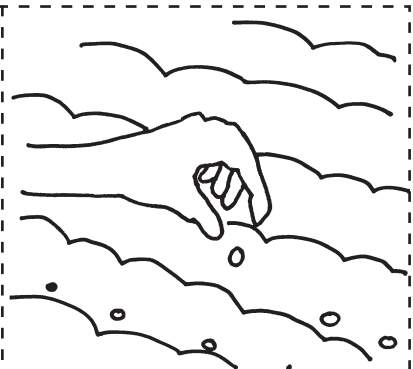
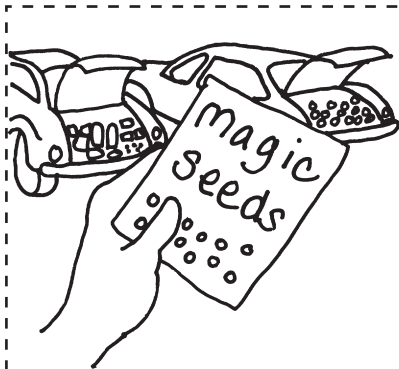
The day Kylie's Dad helped cut the plants down, he won £25 000 on the pools. Perhaps they really were magic seeds!

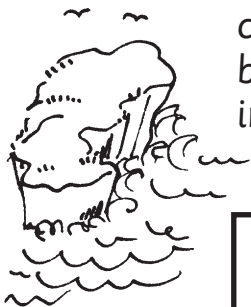
Rajdeep is going round to his sister's after school. She got married last year and lived just down the road.
