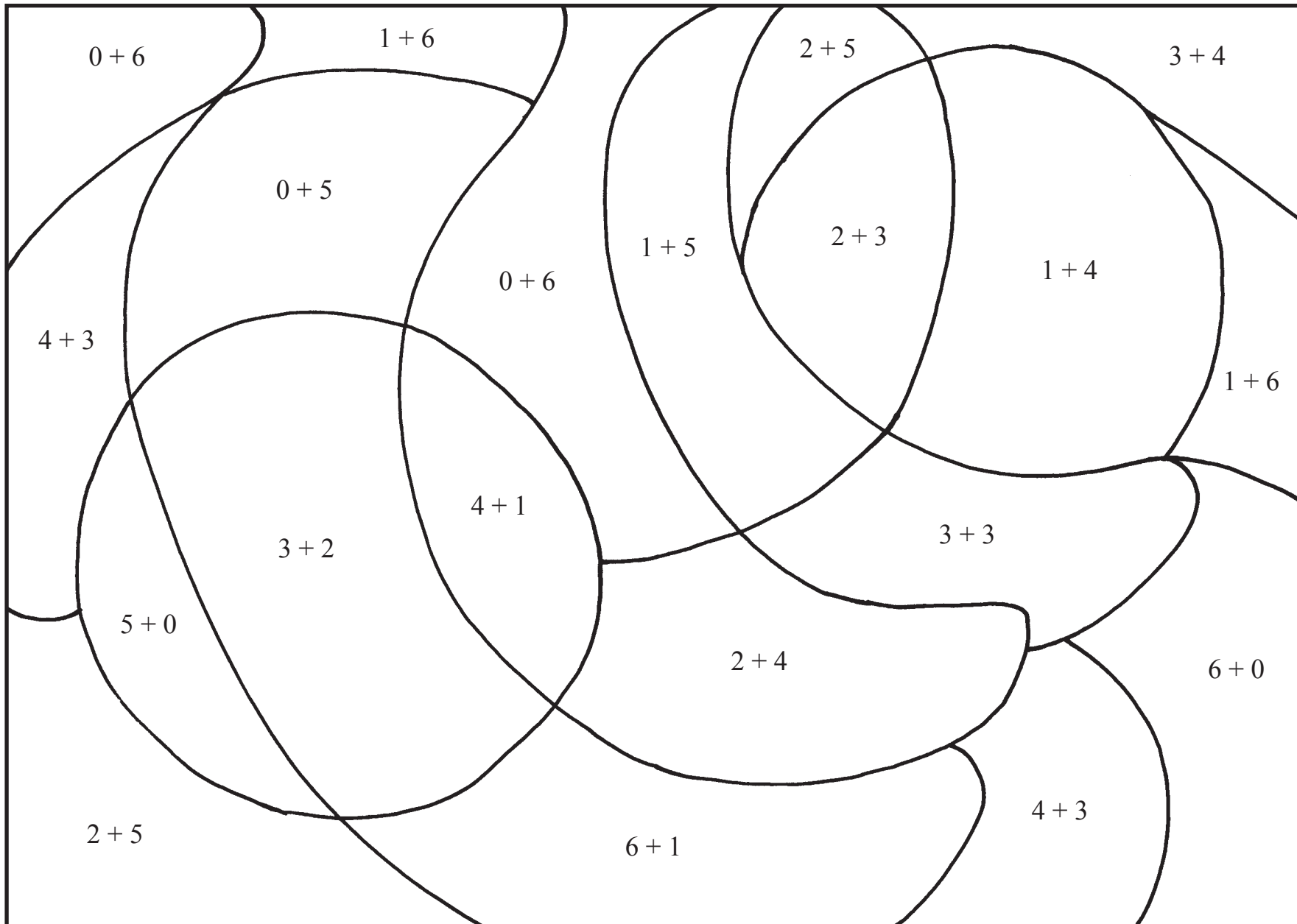

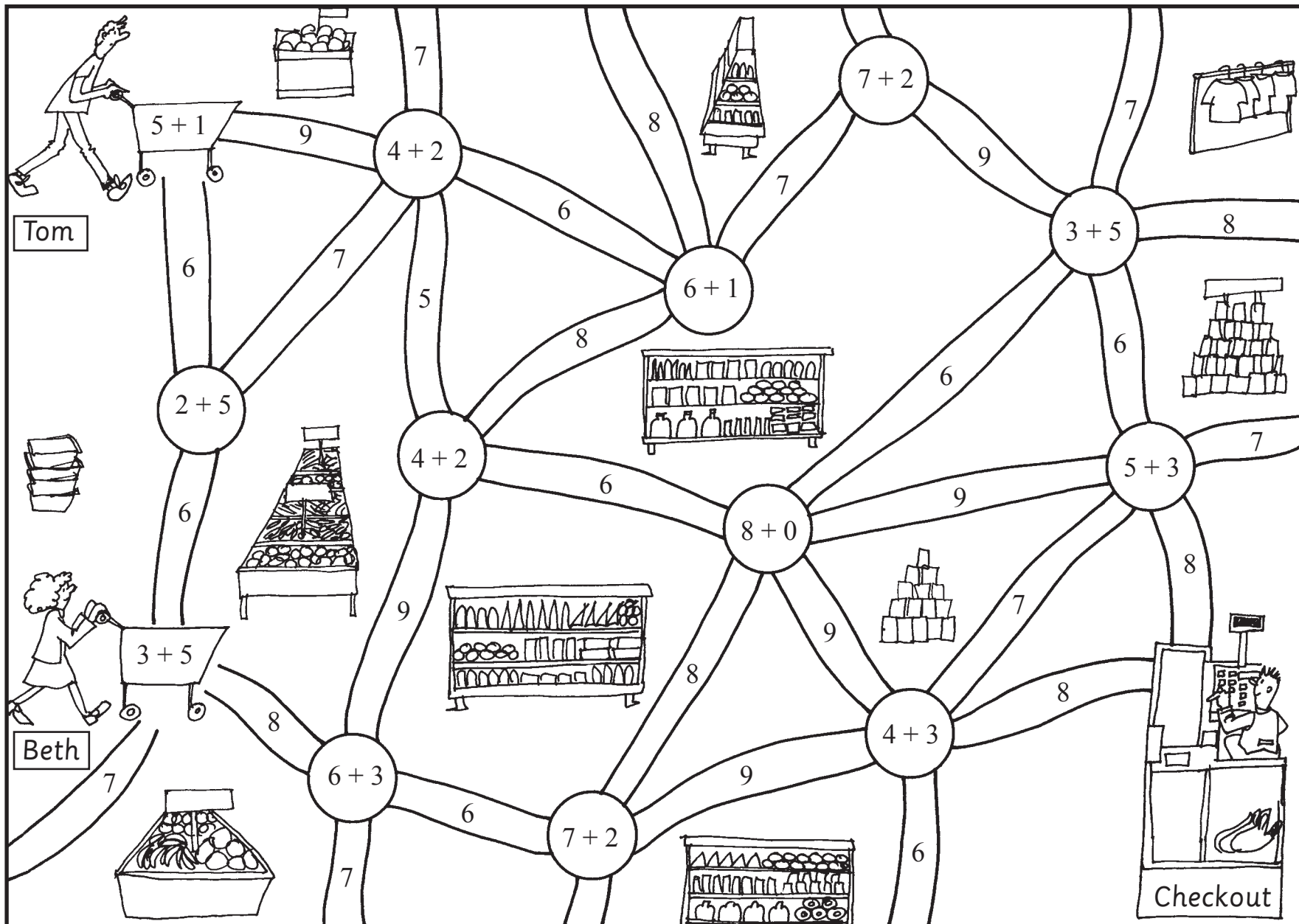

Notes for Teachers

This book can be used to complement the work being undertaken from any maths scheme and to provide additional learning opportunities for pupils working at levels 1 and 2 of the National Curriculum in Mathematics. The aim of this book is to make basic repetitive work on number bonds an enjoyable activity. There is a steady increase in the level of difficulty throughout the book and each page is kept strictly within specific limits. For example, page 1 uses number bonds giving answers between 3 and 5; whilst page 24 uses number bonds giving answers between 49 and 50. A list of these levels can be found on the page opposite.

Each book has a theme to make cross-curricular links possible, should the teacher wish to do so. The theme of book 1 is 'Food'.

There are two types of activity in the book:

Picture pages

In these pages, pupils work out a sum and then look at the key to find which colour links up with that answer. The area for that sum is then coloured in using the appropriate crayon or felt tip. A picture will eventually emerge. Any mistakes in working out the answers should be easily spotted by the teacher. The teacher should decide before the pupils start work, whether this will be an exercise in mental arithmetic or whether counters or calculators might be used and the answers worked out in an exercise book or written on the page.

Trail Pages

In these pages, pupils do the first sum (usually labelled Start) and from this sum the route which corresponds to the answer will lead the pupil to the next sum. The answer to the next sum will be found in one of the routes leading from it and so on to the end. Teachers might like to give pupils a coloured pencil to mark clearly the route which leads to the finish. Sometimes, where there are two trails on a page, two different coloured pencils should be used.
